Revenue:

Revenue through June 30, 2019 for the Park was \$25,351, which is 30% of the 2019 Budget of \$84,000. Prior year 2018 revenue was \$34,040. The decrease is due to 2017 Sponsorship Revenue that was received in 2018.

Fireworks revenue collected year to date is \$3,500. (Prior year was \$13,500. The decrease was due to 2017 Fireworks revenue received in 2018.)

General Membership revenue through June 30, 2019 is \$15,406 which is 77% of the 2019 budget of \$20,000. Prior year membership revenue was \$14,391.

Expenses:

Program Related Expenses year to date are \$21,092 which is 28% of 2019 budget of \$76,200. Prior year program related expenses were approximately \$26,441. The increase is mainly due to the expanded Valentine's Day event.
